agriculture practices to ensure climate-smart agriculture,


Millet promotion, menstrual Health & Hygiene, organic farming and capacity building of People' Institute.

CCD has taken climate change as one of the most important priority areas and initiated to sensitize the tribal community and other community-based organizations for afforestation and organic farming practices. As per the Vision statement, CCD is practicing good governance practices at the community level with community based rehabilitation approaches and enabling the community-based organization members a friendly atmosphere so that all vulnerable sections of communities can live with self-dignity following the Policies and networking with various institutions.

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION OF TRIBAL FAMILES THROUGH SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY IN GUMMA AND KASINAGAR BLOCKS, GAJAPATI

SUPPORTED BY

ACTIVITIES IMPLEMENTED

KKS-BMZ

CCD has been focusing on sustainable livelihood promotion of marginal, smallholder tribal farmers and vulnerable landless families in 6 villages of Tarangada GP and 7 villages of Kasinagar Blocks of Gajapati District initiating land based and animal husbandry practices to ensure food and income security. Major emphasis was laid on empowerment of women farmers for their active participation in household income generating activities.

Land Development

15.20 ha Farm bond / Earthen Bund / Stone Bunding has been constructed by 76 tribal farmers to ensure the soil & water conservation. Till now 333 small farmers are facilitated in cultivating Ragi, Arhor, Cassava and Vegetables in 66 ha. land in Gumma and Kasinagar blocks of Gajapati.

CCD has created additional assets in converting 41.04 ha wasteland to cultivable land by 227 tribal farmers. They are cultivating Paddy, Green Gram, Black Gram, Groundnut, tuber crops, pulses and Sunhemp. Land holding capacity of the smallholder farmers has been increased. The production and productivity as well as annual income has been increased by 26%.

197 small farmers have cultivated Agroforestry in 17.86 Ha.



223 families have promoted Model Farm with multi cropping of Guava, Banana, Pomegranate, Lemon, Drumstick, Mango, Coconut and Jackfruit in 30.10 ha of land to increase annual household income. The farmers are getting income of Rs. 2000/- (Average) in a month from Banana, Lemon and Cassava.









Promotion of Kitchen Garden / Backyard Nutri Garden

The motto is to <u>Grow what you eat & eat what you grow</u>. 186 families have cultivated different vegetables such as Radish, Okra, Brinjal, Palak, Kosala, Ridge guard. During 2024, 146 families have extracted compost from their individual compost pits with 100 to 150 Kg each and used in their agriculture field. Till now 328 families are preparing organic compost in Gumma and Kasinagar Blocks of Gajapati District.

During the year 10 Farmers / Farmer's Groups have received Pumpsets. Chilli, Yardlong beans, Ridge Guard (Long), Tomato, Brinjal, Papaya, Bottle Guard, Bitter Guard using organic manure and pesticides. The tribal families are consuming the nutritious organic vegetables and selling the surplus in their villages and nearby villages. (0.20- 0.25) acres of land. Till now 645 small farmers have cultivated Nutrigarden.

Commercial Vegetable Cultivation

140 farmers have cultivated Brinjal, Couliflower, Tomato, Radish, Beans, Chilli, Ridgeguard, bitter guard and pumpkin in 20.35 ha. in Gumma and Kasinagar Blocks, Gajapati District. Mekhal Raito of Buruda, Kashinagar Block got 170 Kg of chemical free Brinjal from 0.12 ha. They have consumed 30% and sold 70% @ Rs. 40/- per Kg. The income from Brinjal was Rs. 4760.00

Vegetable cultivation using Bucket kit Drip Irrigation

140 tribal farmers are using Bucket Kit drip irrigation to ensure water facilities atleast 9 months in a year and yielding the vegetables 3 times in a year. The farmers are getting the income of Rs. 7500/- (Average) in a year from the vegetables like Brinjal, Tomato, Radish, Ladies Finger, Onion and Long Beans. The Annual household income is enhanced by 20%.

Animal Husbandry (Goat & Chick Rearing)

112 vulnerable landless families were supported by KKS-BMZ for Goat Rearing (One Male and 3 Female Goats each) with total INR 27200 (project support of Rs. 17,200/ - plus their own contribution of Rs. 10,000/-) to ensure their annual household income in Gumma and Kasinagar blocks. During the period 85 families have sold 101 Goats in the market and got INR. 8,12,400. Annual household income security is assured from Rs. 8000/- to Rs. 12500/- depending on number goats and Chicks per family.

20 Bee hives have been provided to 20 landless / vulnerable families. 15 families have extracted 44 litre of Honey and sold @ 600 per litre = Rs. 26400. Each household income is Rs. 1760.

280 farmers were supported agri equipments with nominal price with the support of KKS-BMZ.











CASE STUDY

Jaya Naika lives together with his wife and his 4 children in IAY house at Endry that is located in a hilly & remote area without public transport. Two years ago, Jaya applied for the construction of stone bund before the village development committee along with other 11 no. of farmers with the approval of village development committee. Jaya Naika constructed 930 ft of stone bund on his land. In total the costs amounted Rs.12000. The implementation of the project gave a remarkable agriculture development. "I could increase the percentage of land use 30%" Jaya delighted" as a matter of fact, even our annual income from the podu land had a considerable increase from 1 lakhs to 1.40 lakh.

Jaya astonished the changes that have taken place after transplanting the hill broom in the stone bund area. In the short period i.e in the month of February-2024 he has earned Rs.40,000/- by selling the hill broom in a lump sum and preparing brooms.

SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION AND EMPOWERMENT OF SOURA TRIBES IN RAYAGADA AND R.UDAYAGIRI BLOCKS, **GAJAPATI DISTRICT**

SUPPORTED BY **MISEREOR-KZE**

- 2034 tribal families (97%) of the tribal families have adopted sustainable Agriculture practices using organic compost in Paddy, Ragi, Vegetable cultivation, fruit bearing plantation activities and practice of nutritious food consumption especially for pregnant, lactating month, adolescent and children.
- 1625 (78%) households have mobilized social security schemes, livelihood support like Skill development trainings, cashew saplings, Chicks, Rice huller and flour mills from Government under Mission Jeevika and Jan Shiksha Sansthan, Government of India through convergence.
- Now 914(45%) households have adopted organic nutri garden using organic fertilizer and organic compost.
- Annual income of PwDs, landless and vulnerable households will be increased by 22% through Goat, Chick rearing and other seasonal agro business.
- 1175 (57%) women members are actively participating in MGNREGA and Marketing activities.
- Now 1950 (95%) members have enrolled as shareholders in Mahendragiri Women Cooperative Society Itd and out of 1950 members, 1635 (80%) members have accessed the cooperative services i.e., savings & credit transactions. The Annual turnover of the cooperative increased by 26%.
- 3 Women producers group with 602 members are selling their agro-horti-NTFPs such as Turmeric, Tamarind, Broom, vegetables, mango, maize and millets in local market and linking to the market directly with the encouragement of Cooperative. With the efforts of their active involvement in market with seasonal business the distress sale was reduced by 60%.



Average Annual Household income per member is Rs. 4500.00 from Rice Mill, Grocery Shop and Pan Shop

SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION & NUTRITION SECURITY

Odisha Millet Mission
Supp. by Deptt. Agriculture - ATMA,
Govt. of Odisha

CCD is focusing on enhancing the Production and Productivity of Ragi and other Minor Millets in Gumma and Kasinagar Block adopting SMI, Line Transplantation with the technical support of WASSAN. Major emphasis has been laid on regular consumption of Millets and value addition of Millet in preparing different tiffin items. During the period, 445 smallholder farmers of Gumma & Kasinagar Block have sold their Ragi of 5045.93 qtl at Mandi @ Rs. 3578/- per qtl. Tribal farmers were encouraged with the incentives for adopting SMI and LT of Ragi and enhancing MSP from Government. The tribal farmers are interested to cultivate Ragi in more acres to get more incentives and more income.



MUKHYA MANTRI JANAJATI JEEVIKA MSSION (MMJJM) Supported by ST & Minority Deptt., Govt. of Odisha

CCD is implementing MMJJM in Five Tribal sub-plan blocks of Gajapati District with the support of ST & Minority Deptt., Govt. of Odisha for the livelihood promotion and income security of tribal families focusing on On-Farm and Off-Farm activities.



During the period the following support have been provided to tribal farmers to improve their income.

- Weighing machines provided to 50 farmers in 11 villages of Chandiput, Paniganda, Luhagudi, Kattama, Merapalli, Govindapur, Adava, Pindiki and Sikulipadar GPs of Mohona Block.
- Life Jackets have been provided to 100 fisherman 8 villages in Adava & Birikote GPs for save their lifes during caching fish in the Adava Dam and improve their income security.
- ◆ 1021 households from 37 village have engaged in MGNREGA. 20575 humandays generated and received Rs. 48,76,275 income. Average household income was Rs. 4775.00

CCD has been emphasizing on Women Empowerment through improving their Socioeconomic potential and enhancing their active participation in every developmental activities for mobilization of resources from Government especially from Mission Shakti, Mukhyamantri Janajati Jeevika Mission and Odisha Livelihood Mission. With the efforts of CCD and Women Cooperative Societies promoted by CCD (Gajapati Women Cooperative Society Itd and Mahendragiri Women Cooperative Society Itd), now the women are coming forward with linking to market and mobilization of resources through convergence from Government.

During the quarter, 379 SHG meetings have been organized and sensitized them on Panchasutra of Odisha Livelihood Mission and also sensitized on different skill development trainings. 60 women from 6 SHGs have received Rs.4,50,000/- from Odisha Livelihood Mission for seasonal business.

CASE STUDY

Malati Sabar, a resident of Sogam village, is the leader of the self-help group (SHG) "Brundabati." With a total of 8 family members, Malati ventured into goat rearing as a sustainable livelihood opportunity. Mrs. Malati's initiative showcases the transformative power of community-based animal husbandry projects supported by the Veterinary Department &. Malati and her fellow SHG members diligently applied the skills acquired during the training sessions. They established goat shelter, ensuring proper ventilation and hygiene.

Additionally, they formulated a balanced diet for the goats, incorporating locally available fodder and supplements. Malati Sabar's initiative not only transformed the economic landscape of SHG Brundabati but also inspired neighboring communities. The success story of sustainable goat rearing highlighted the importance of collective action, knowledge sharing, and government support in uplifting rural livelihoods. Presently she has 18 female Goats and 6 Male Goats totalling to 24 Goats.

Organized World Physiotherapy Day inviting DSSO and other SSEPD officials at District level.

403 meetings of PwD groups have been organized to empower the PwD members on promotion of micro enterprises, maintenance of Records and advocacy with Gram Panchayat Level Federation to access the financial support.

CCD - SAMARTH has organized C-20 side event "Economic Empowerment and Livelihood of Peresons with Disabilities

CCD and SAMARTH have organized District level Workshop on SDG Impact on Disability in collaboration of District Administration. SAMARTH members have requested the District / Block / Panchayat administration for localization of SDG so that every PwD members including other stakeholders would get the knowledge on SDG and implementation. Mr. Saroj Das has attended as the Resource Person. Chairman, Zillz Parishad, District Collector, PD and other District officials have participated.

CASE STUDY

Namrata Bhuyan is a 11 years old girl of Pegada Village, Rayagada Block, Gajapati was suffering with CP since childhood. Her parents could not detect her problem after birth. Gradually her health condition has diminished. Her father is a daily labourer and mother is taking care of the house hold activities. With the limited income they could not afford for her treatment. She is sitting in one place and unable to speak, She has stopped going to school.

CCD identified her and she was under physiotherapy treatment. With the support of SSEPD, Govt. of Odisha, our Physiotherapist is taking care of Namrata. Namrata is now able to walk without support and improved 30% of her health and can do some ADLs activities with less assistance (like eating, dressing, combing, bathing) and also she could go for toilet, Everyone in the family feel happy with her health improvement and going to school.

Manasi is the younger daughter and her elder sister is studying in graduation. Manasi discontinued her education in the 9th class as the school is far from her home and also due to the poor financial condition of her family. After leaving the school, she engaged in domestic work and helped her mother. Her father is an alcohol addicted person. ""Without the knowledge of Manasi, her father fixed her engagement for marriage. The relatives and well-wishers of Manasi communicated this message to CCD. CCD has taken this matter into grave concern and communicated to District Child Protection Unit. Immediately a team consisting of DCPU, Police, ICDS workers, Religious leaders, SHG members, PRI members, and CCD staff visited her house and sensitized both families (Bride and Groom) about the legal consequences of child marriage as well as health aspects of the Girl child married at early age. Both of the families realized and submitted a written undertaking to stop the marriage. After counseling to Manasi, CWC has taken steps and enrolled Manasi into Open School, Rayagada to continue her education. Both of the families have also been recognized for Manasi's well-being.

- Promotion of Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) strategies.
- Review of Organization Development Initiatives a part of Impression Management to strengthen staff and organization capacity.
- Review and Revisit of Organization Policies in the new year.
- Promotion of value added products of Millets, Jackfruit and Horticulture.
- Promotion of Family Focused Development Program.
