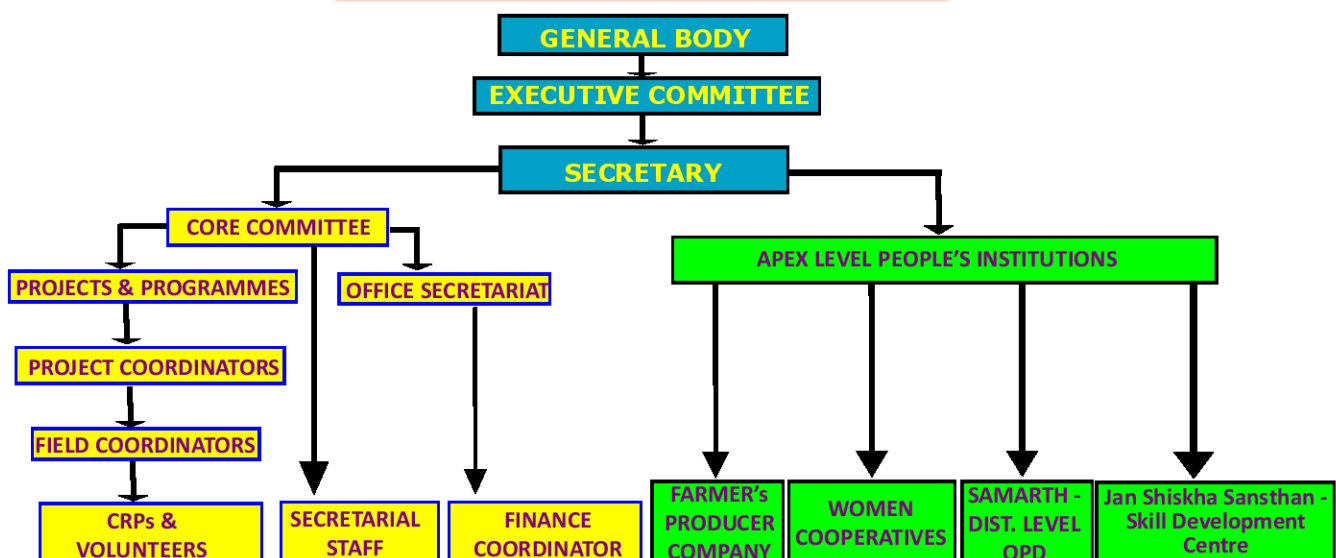

ORGANOGRAM OF CCD

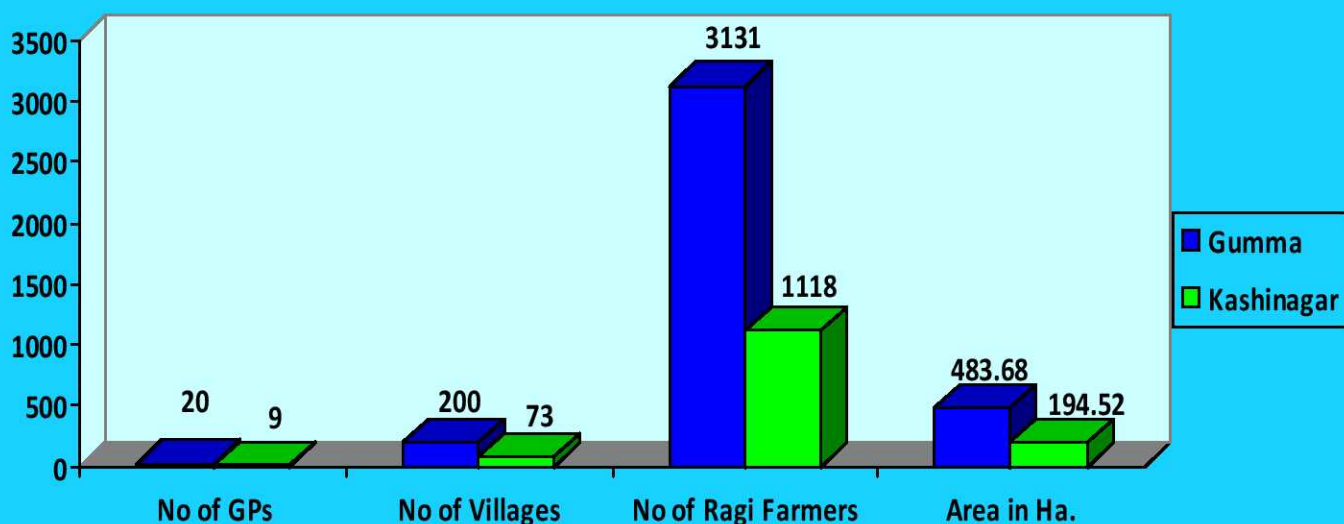


Sustainable Livelihood Promotion of Small & Marginal Tribal Farmers Through Odisha Millet Mission (OMM) by agronomic Practices



With the support of Odisha Millets Mission and technical support of WASSAN, CCD is implementing Millets program in Gumma and Kashinagar Block of Gajapati District encouraging the tribal farmers on Millets cultivation adopting agronomic practices. Now the tribal farmers are cultivating Millets and ensuring the income sources by selling the Millets at Government Mandi and getting Rs. 4287/- per qtl. In addition to income, consumption practices of the tribal families has been increased. Regular increase of MSP and Incentives by the Government, the tribal farmers are inspired to adopt the Millets cultivation.

Improvement of Livelihoods of disadvantaged indigenous communities through Climate Smart agriculture including Animal Husbandry and land development supported by KKS-BMZ



(in 6 tribal villages of Tarangada GP, Gumma and 7 tribal villages of Partada GP, Kasinagar Block in Gajapati District, Odisha)



- One vulnerable / landless family was supported Goats (1 male goat & 4 female goats) for income generation.
- 92 tribal farmers are cultivating Hill Broom, Ragi, Ground nut, Vegetables, Black Gram, Green Gram, Cassava, Pulses and Green Manure plantation in 19.60 ha of Farm bund developed field and on the bunds. From vegetables, the farmers got INR 4000 (average) each. Other crops are in the field.
- Development of Fallow land in 0.20 ha by One tribal farmer. During the quarter total of 127 farmers have cultivated Paddy, Ragi, Pulses and Green Manure in 29.20 ha.
- Promotion of Agroforestry in 6.4 ha by 6 tribal farmers.
- 3 families were supported Nutrigarden / kitchen garden for consumption of organic vegetables. 425 families are cultivating Okra, Bottle Guard, Bitter Guard, Brinjal, Long beans and Chilli for daily consumption.
- 27 families were supported vegetable seeds to promote vegetables through drip irrigation in 13.64 ha.
- 2 families have promoted Model Farm in 1.6 ha. They got seed and seedlings to promote dragon fruit.
- 15 farmers enrolled as membership in Ujayalla Farmers Producers Company Ltd.
- 4 Nos of Fish Pond (0.50 acres each) developed and sanctioned INR 440000 each for pisciculture by District Fishery Department, Gajapati District. The farmers installed Bee keeping unit at the bund of the pond at Kurlandaguda Village, Tarangada GP of Gumma Block.
- One Community Compost Pit was sanctioned by DRDA, Gajapati at Kurlandaguda.
- INR 300000 was sanctioned by DRDA, Gajapati for construction of Community Toilet and Bathroom.

During this quarter, CCD has focused on Organic Cultivation, strengthening the women SHGs and income generation by the tribal families. Village meetings have been organized to aware and motivate the tribal farmers on agriculture development and convergence with Agriculture and Horticulture departments for resource mobilization.

312 families from 30 villages of 8 GPs have cultivated different crops in 706 ha.

The villagers were encouraged to participate in NGNREGA, Palli Sabha, linkage with government departments for resource mobilization through convergence. The unemployed youth were motivated to join in the trainings at RSETI, Jana Siksha Sansthan and Desai Foundation to get better employment and self-employment opportunities.

CCD is focusing on Women Empowerment and Micro Enterprise promotion promoting and strengthening Women SHGs, Women Cooperatives, Women producer Groups to enable the women on marketing of agro-horti-NTF products at local market / Weekly haats organizing capacity building trainings, savings & credit management as well as encourage the women groups for Liaisoning with Banks, Odisha Livelihood Mission, ITDA and Gram panchayat level Federation to access to finance support for business activities.

During this quarter, 6 women members joined as shareholders in Mahendragiri Women Cooperative Society Ltd. The Cooperative is operating savings & credit management to enhance the income of the women members to make them self-dependent and self-reliant. Till now 1956 women members are the shareholders of the cooperative and 1641 members are regularly accessing the credit support from the cooperative.

Supported by Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities Deptt., Govt. of Odisha

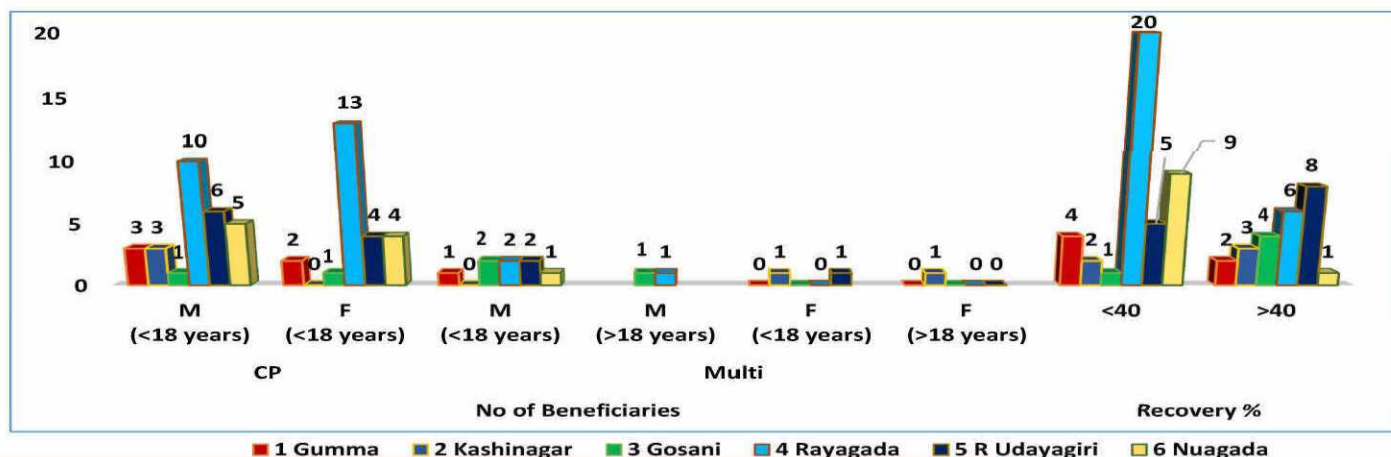
CCD has been providing Therapeutic & Rehabilitative Services for the 65 Children with Intellectual Disabilities in Gajapati District using necessary therapy equipments for the Children. The parents are being provided therapy exercise training on different techniques so that they are able to continue the therapy services to their children atleast 3 - 4 times in a month. 24 Children have recovered by 40% - 80% With continuous Therapy services by our Physiotherapist. If necessary, the experts from Government department are facilitating to provide Therapy exercise and technical assistance to the physiotherapist. Our Physiotherapy Ms. Sarojini Raito providing full concentration towards the children with Intellectual Disabilities and their family for their social development.

STATUS OF CHILDREN WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES



CASE STUDY

Amar Bhuyan is 13 years boy, residing with his parents in a interior village called S.Jalango, Rayagada Block, Gajapati. He is affected by Cerebral Palsy (CP). Since childhood, he was unable to walk and could not do his Daily Living Activities by himself, parents were very much worried for Amar. In the year of 2021 CCD has identified him and made counseling to the parents for physiotherapy treatment supported by SSEPD, Govt. of Odisha. Last 3 years our Physiotherapist is providing physiotherapy treatment 3 - 4 times in a month. At present he has improved 50% and now he is walking better. He is studying in 8th class in Government High school Rayagada and he is travelling in auto alone without any support of his parents and also doing Daily Living Activities (ADL) at home independently. Now parents are very happy to see the child's improvement.



HEROS FOR HUMANITY

Protection of Child Rights - Prevention of Child Trafficking

CCD has been working for Child Protection and Child Trafficking especially preventing Child Marriage, Child Labour in 50 villages of Rayagada Block of Gajapati District in collaboration with District Child Protection Officer, Police Personnel, Panchayatiraj Institutions, Community Based Organizations & Stakeholders prevention of Child marriage Act, POCSO Act, Child Labour Act, Right to Education and different Government schemes. Sensitization programs are going on at village level, schools, religious institutions, village level child protection committee, women Self-Help Groups, adolescents and youth leaders

During the reporting period, the following programs have been organized on Prevention of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and Different Government Schemes on Protection of Children from Sexual Offence & Rehabilitation of Droup Out children.
