## SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION WITH FOOD, INCOME & NUTRITION SECURITY

CCD has been prioritizing on utilization of existing natural resources for livelihood promotion through regenerative agriculture, bio-diversity conservation - organic farming, land development, soil & water conservation measures, plantation of fruit bearing trees and market linkages.

***During the reporting period the following activities were executed with the support of KKS-BMZ:***

- ☞ 2.40 ha of Farm bund constructed by 12 small land holder farmers
- ☞ Agro-forestry promoted by 4 farmers in 1.50 ha with plantation of Banana, Jackfruit, Mango, Guava, Coconut plants.
- ☞ Home Garden / Backyard Nutri Garden promoted by 187 families to get nutritious vegetables for daily consumption.
- ☞ 14 vulnerable / landless families were supported 4 - 5 Goats each to enhance their annual income.
- ☞ Model Farms promoted by 18 farmers in 1.20 ha.
- ☞ 242 families have extracted organic compost (100 to 150 Kg each) from their compost pits. The organic compost used in their agriculture field to get nutritious food / vegetables.
- ☞ 80 farmers received Agro-Implements each namely Finger Weeder - 2 nos, Finger Weeder Long handle - 2 nos, Cycle Weeder - 2 nos, Agrimate Sprayer - 2 nos and Bush Cutter - 2 nos.
- ☞ 10 Women SHGs have received Agro-Implements each namely Finger Weeder - 2 nos, Finger Weeder Long handle - 2 nos, Cycle Weeder - 2 nos, Agrimate Sprayer - 2 nos, Bush Cutter - 2 nos, Pump Set - 1 no and Power & Manual Sprayer - 2 nos.

Agro Implements provided to women SHG members supported by KKS-BMZ

CCD is emphasizing to enhance the income & nutrition security to the tribal families especially focusing on women, adolescent and Children (0 - 6 years) to reduce under nutrition through regular consumption of Millets. With the support of Odisha Millets Mission, Government of Odisha, CCD is implementing Millet project in Gumma and Kasinagar Blocks of Gajapati District with technical support of WASSAN.

## WOMEN EMPOWERMENT AND MICRO ENTERPRISE PROMOTION

One of the important focus area of CCD is Women Empowerment and Micro enterprise promotion to enable the Women in enhancing their leadership, sustainable income and livelihood to live with self-reliant and dignity. To ensure financial inclusion, CCD is linking the Women self-help groups to the banks and women cooperatives and also encourage the Women to establish good liaisoning with Government department to mobilize financial support and other resources through convergence under Mukhyamantri Janajati Jeevika Mission-ITDA, Jeevika Mission-OLM and other line departments to enhance their household income. The women members are being encouraged by Gajapati Women Cooperative and Mahendragiri Women Cooperative in getting income opportunities through market linkage and selling of agro-horti and Non-Timber Forest Produces at market / local weekly haat and linking to FPO.

66 Children with Intellectual Disabilities are being provided Physiotherapy services by our Physiotherapist with necessary therapy equipments and also providing training to the Parents on different techniques of Therapy exercise so that they can able to continue the therapy services to their children atleast 3 - 4 times in a month. 28 Children have recovered by 25% - 80% With continuous Therapy services supported by SSEPD.

#### **CASE STUDY - 1**

Jinu charan Raita is a 12 years boy residing in Janglo village of Nuagada Block. Due to lack of early detection by the parents, he became affected by Cerebral Palsy (CP). Since birth he was unable to walk properly and also could not do his Daily Living Activities by himself, parents were very much upset and worried about his education and health because he is the only son in the family. His father is a teacher in Jangalo village Government school and mother is a house wife. As a father and teacher, he has also very much interested to provide education to his son - Jinu.

In the year of 2020 CCD staff identified him and started physiotherapy treatment on regular basis. Last 7 years he is under physiotherapy treatment. Now Jinu charan has improved 50% of his health conditions. He is studying in 6<sup>th</sup> class at Village Government School. Jinu charan is walking better than before with the supportive device which is called Gaiter and doing Daily Living Activities (ADL) independently. Now the parents are very happy seeing the improvement of their son. The parents have expressed their thanks to SSEPD and CCD for providing regular Physiotherapy services and taking care of Jinu.



#### **CASE STUDY - 2**

Sontosini Karjee is a 14 years old, living in Chligada of R.Udayagiri Block, Gajapati. She hails from a poor family. Her father is a daily labourer and mother is taking care of the house hold activities. She is affected with CP Rt. Hemiplegic

She was struggling to do the Daily Living Activities in Rt. Hand Like she was not able to do anything with Rt. Hand for example eating and was not able to pick up and hold materials. In the year of 2021 she was identified by CCD. After diagnosis, she was under physiotherapy treatment. Sontosini is studying in 7th standard. The parents were not knowing what to do and where to take the child for treatment. After regular physiotherapy treatment, Sontosini is now able to walk without support. Her family is happy to see the improvement of 30% of her health and can do some ADLs activities like eating, dressing, combing, bathing, helping her mother to cut vegetable and washing utensils in the kitchen. The parents have expressed their thanks to SSEPD and CCD for providing regular Physiotherapy services and taking care of Sontosini.

Three Children became orphan after the death of Father 2 years back and death of mother one month back. The orphan children were living on the street of Jeerango in vulnerable condition. Mrs. Risapa Bhuyan, the Sarpanch of Jeerango has informed CCD regarding the orphan children. The Child Protection project team of CCD along with Sarpanch, ICDS Supervisor and Anganawadi Worker visited Jeerango and met with the Orphan children. They came to know that the elder sister is working as daily labour and serving 2 siblings. Her earning is not sufficient to get 2 times food for 3 children. Sometimes the villagers and Anganawadi Workers are offering food for the orphan children.

Immediately the CCD team have taken action for medical test of the children and produced before District Child Working Committee for their rehabilitation. With the efforts of CCD team in collaboration of Government personnel, two children enrolled in school and rehabilitated at Child Home at R. Sitapur and Gumma. The younger child was rehabilitated in a Special Adoption Agency.

Now two children are continuing their education. Sarpanch and other stakeholders have expressed their thanks to CCD team for their noble work.

CCD - Child Protection team got the news from Sarpanch and ASHA of Gangabado that 5 orphan children are living in very precarious living condition. After hearing the news, CCD team have reached the village and conducted a meeting with Children, their near & dears and villagers regarding their rehabilitation. The orphan siblings were produced before District Child Protection Unit and approached for their rehabilitation. After fulfilling necessary legal paper works by CWC, the children were placed in Urban Hostel residential school, Paralakhemundi and Utkal Balashram Child Care Institution. CCD team has monitored regularly the wellbeing of the children and requested the villagers and other stakeholders to provide moral support for the orphan children so that they can cope up with new environment and to get success in their life with smile. With the collaborative efforts of District Administration, CCD team and the villagers, the orphan children are being rehabilitated with education, food and shelter.
